

People travel from all over the world to visit one of the hotels in Kenya and share breakfast with the hotel's stars, the tallest animals in the world. The luxurious Giraffe Manor Hotel in the capital Nairobi is located in the middle of the forests inhabited by a small group of Rothschild's giraffes, which are threatened with extinction due to the loss of their original habitat. Giraffes are the tallest animals on earth thanks to their towering legs and long necks that can reach up to five and a half metres, allowing them to eat leaves and buds that other animals may not be able to reach. Built in the 1930s as a private home and renovated as a Scottish hunting lodge, today it has twelve rooms and offers guests the chance of a lifetime to get out and enjoy these magnificent giraffes. A giraffe's tongue can reach up to 53 centimetres, allowing it to eat leaves from high branches. A giraffe's sleep time does not exceed thirty minutes a day, divided into short naps. Giraffes are slow chewers, which can make their mealtimes last between 16 and 20 hours a day. To feel full, a giraffe needs to eat around 34 kilograms of tree leaves a day.
