

Spanish prevails in most countries. Other European languages spoken include: Italian in Brazil and Argentina, German in southern Brazil, southern Chile and Argentina, and Welsh in southern Argentina. Many countries, especially in the Caribbean, have their own Kari'ana (indigenous) languages, derived from European languages and various African dialects. Guaraní, along with Spanish, is the official language of Paraguay, and is spoken by the majority of the population. Moreover, about 10 million people speak the Quechua language in South America and Spain, but more than half of them live in Bolivia and Peru (about 6,700,800 individuals).
