

The narrator in *Lord of the Flies* is a separate, unnamed, impartial narrator who is aware of what is happening in the story as well as what all of the characters are thinking. The style of narration is person omniscient point of view. So, Lord of the Flies has a third person narrator. The narrator is omniscient, with access to the characters' thoughts and feelings: "Ralph was annoyed and, for the moment, defeated. Here, we can guess Piggy's emotions through the description of his actions. He observes the boys collectively when they are together, for example when they have meetings. (pp. 17-18).
