McGraw Hill 5 Ethics and the Law There are no absolute or indisputable rules or principles that can be developed to decide if an action is ethical or unethical. Neither laws nor ethics are fixed principles. Ethical beliefs can change over time. McGraw Hill 6 Changes in Ethics over Time Changing ethical beliefs influence the law. Examples: Marijuana use.
