listen to the conversation complete the first column of the chart with the peoples wishes look at all those children's look at us we are so lucky we've always had what we needed a home food close school presents friends and I think that we find something to complain about all the time well Tina it's the way of the world I'm afraid but you're right we shouldn't complain I wish we could do something to help as well how about starting a campaign I've always wanted to do that we could start a campaign at school and we could also ask our families to help I think that's the coolest thing I've heard you say wait to go let's do it I wish I could be as clever oh come on Gena it's not clever so many people do all that time fine but thanks anyway okay so let's think about what we need to do if I can paint I'd make a poster but I can't draw a straight line great Gena you're not so bad Lynn I can try but I wish I had the right kind of materials do you know poster paints and glossy sheets of paper and I know I'll ask my father they keep a stock of material at the company maybe they'll want to contribute so are we going to ask for sponsors we should make a list of people that are worth contacting and we need to write a letter or some informational material to give them I wouldn't just handout money to people just because they ask me for it I wish we had some money ourselves then we wouldn't have to ask anyone yes well so do I and I'm sure Lynn feels the samething and and then we can all discuss and finalise it please don't say no I would do it if I could but I can't write I wish I could you're such a talented writer do you know how to present things to people thanks bud I am not so sure can we do it together Lynn I would feel so much better if we did this together yes sure no problem when now why not the sooner the better I wish we could change the world this minute be listen again try to figure out the reasons for the peoples wishes and complete the second column of the chart share your ideas in small groups then report in class
