Nevertheless, Stalin did not immediately close the door to negotia tions with the democracies; on April.7 17 Molotov proposed to the British and French ambassadors in Moscow the formation of a triple alliance against German aggression. The preparations, however, pro– eded in leisurely fashion, and even at that late date the British Govern– appeared to have no realistic estimate of the danger, no accurate no– of the forces involved, and, above all, no conception of the absolute cessity for an immediate and binding agreement with the Soviet UNION. On April 8, 1939, Litvinov resigned as commissar of foreign affairs, and his portfolio was taken over by the premier (chairman of the Council of People's Commissars), .Viacheslav Molotov
