Aside from these distinguishing garments, the Bhutanese guy may be seen wearing a variety of colored 'Kabneys,' also known as scarves. The highest judicial authority, the judge, is represented by a green kabney, whilst the district administrator is represented by a crimson scarf with white stripes. Every Bhutanese is required to follow this etiquette while interacting with higher–ranking officials or attending major national events. Such kabney delineation about the status of the men's authoritative power is seen as an act of acknowledgment. Bhutan's royal majesty wears a yellow scarf.
