Second, it is necessary to introduce a variety of reading materials, including contemporary literature and cultural stories, which reflect students' interests and help them relate to the content. Through these changes, we can achieve significant improvement in students' reading and writing skills, which contributes to their academic success. The new curriculum is full of writing exercises; we need more realistic texts that are appropriate for the age group and academic level. For me, the old curriculum (Ana Amer) was much stronger in conveying and strengthening skills than the new curriculum. I would like to see curricula that focus more on interactive and practical activities that enhance reading and writing skills, such as using interesting stories and group discussions.
