Based on previous evidence on the developmental sequence of PA (rhyme, syllable, and phoneme) it was predicted that the comparison group would score higher on the rhyme detection, syllable blending, phoneme isolation, and phoneme blending tasks, as well as in WM tasks (backward digit recall, counting recall, and listening recall). The one-way ANOVAs revealed that the at-risk group did score lower on all seven tasks: rhyme detection, $F(1,38) = 185.139$, syllable blending, $F(1,38) = 257.139$; phoneme isolation, $F(1,38) = 447.264$; backward digit recall, $F(1,38) = 89.223$; counting recall, $F(1,38) = 71.849$; and listening recall, $F(1,38) = 52.073$, respectively.
