Both "must" and "have to" are used to express obligation or necessity to do something, but there are some subtle differences between them: 1. \*\*Meaning\*\*: – \*\*must\*\*: Used to express a strong necessity or obligation, often conveying a personal opinion or judgment. For example, "You must see this movie" suggests a strong feeling that watching the movie is essential. – \*\*have to\*\*: Used to indicate a necessity or obligation resulting from external circumstances.
