One major exception was Iberia (most of today's Spain, Portugal, and Southern France), where a Muslim dynasty established a strong state in the 700s. The Huns and Germanic tribes began to migrate into the Roman Empire by around 300 AD, some such as the Lombards settled in Europe's river valleys. During this period, the cities and vast trade networks of the Roman Empire largely vanished. His most important victory was the battle of Tours in 732, when he led Frankish warriors to defeat a Muslim army from Spain. The Rise of the Franks In 486, the Frankish leader Clovis I defeated the last Roman army in Western Europe. These tribes divided Europe into a collection of small, warring Kingdoms.
