

One might think that it is easy to define a library. Referencing (or citing) the source in the written text of the paper is called in-text citation. But here is a video that explains how in-text citations in APA referencing style work: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=hKu2-tjNMok> It is a short form of reference that includes the last name of author(s), the year of publication, and the page number in case of a direct quote. There are many referencing styles depending on the subject discipline. Still, students may confuse 'the library' with 'the Internet' as many library resources are available on the Internet and many Internet resources are found in Libraries. (No /yes ) Answer: Do you think that pieces of information found in libraries have the same value (reliability) as those found on the Internet? You should check with your department first about which referencing style they are adopting. Warm-up activity: Take a few minutes and think whether library research and internet research refer to the same thing.
