Kuwait International Airport Terminal 2 is located in Sabhan Area. Close to the building, the landscaping is a lush oasis, with strands of drier planting and species native to the desert climate extending further away from the terminal. Targeting LEED 'gold', it aims to be the first passenger terminal in the world to attain this level of environmental accreditation and combines the thermal properties of the concrete structure with a large expanse of roof–mounted photovoltaic panels to harvest solar energy. The canopy extends to shade a generous entrance plaza and is supported by tapering concrete columns – their fluid, organic forms draw inspiration from the contrast between the solidity of the stone and the shape and movement of Kuwait's traditional dhow sailing boats. It is planned to significantly increase capacity and establish a new regional air hub in the Gulf – these strategic aims will be matched by a state–of–the–art terminal building, which will provide the highest levels of comfort for passengers and will set a new environmental benchmark for airport buildings.
