

19-year-old man presents with dry, itchy skin and O/E erythematous, lichenified plaques in the popliteal fossae, most likely diagnosis? A 30-year-old stressed out medical student presents to your clinic with a worsening painful rash on one side of her chest. She is up-to-date on her vaccinations because of medical school and complains that this rash is interfering with studying for the upcoming final block of examinations. Physical examination demonstrates a linear group of vesicles with erythema on her left chest following a dermatomal pattern. She denies any prior spots like this and has no other medical problems.
