

In her book, *A Life in the Trees*, journalist¹ Rebecca Moore travels 15,000 Kilometres (km) from London to Papua New Guinea. In Papua New Guinea, Rebecca meets the Kombai people.² Moore lived with the Kombai women and children for three months. The Kombai people have no watches and no cars.³ The Kombai get up every morning at sunrise. Kombai men hunt in the jungle. They also cut down sago palms.⁴ The most important part of Kombai life is building their tree houses. Kombai life is very different. The Kombai people eat this food for breakfast, lunch and dinner. Each house is 20 metres (m) high. She talks about their lives in the jungle.
