I think over the challenges that confronted me, the lessons that were imparted to me, and the growth that I have personally achieved especially on the aspect of communication and professionalism in my work as a radiology technologist. Furthermore, this dysphagia made it necessary for me to be careful about how I worded my questions so as to not cause any discomfort, and I had to depend on relatives for other vital medical details. In conclusion, I discussed the difficulties I encountered while taking Anwar Mohammed's medical history, especially due to his Alzheimer's disease and dysphagia.
