

FELIPE ESCUDERO DESIGNED A SIMPLE YET ELEGANT SINGLE-STORY HOME LOCATED NEAR THE CHIMBORAZO MOUNTAIN OF THE ANDES IN ECUADOR. FELIPE NAMED THIS FINE DESIGN THE CLOVER HOUSE DUE TO ITS TREFOIL PLAN THAT ILLUSTRATES A CURVACEOUS CONCRETE SHAPE WITH 3 PETAL-SHAPED WINGS. ONE CONTINUOUS WALL DIVIDES THE HOUSE INTO VOLUMES SO THAT ALL THE SPACES RECEIVE NATURAL SUNLIGHT THROUGHOUT THE DAY. THE RESULT IS ONE CONCRETE WALL THAT SHAPES THE INTERIOR SPACES AS MUCH AS THE EXTERIOR ONES. CLOVER HOUSE, A LOW-COST RESIDENCE LOCATED 3,600M ABOVE SEA LEVEL WHERE TEMPERATURES ARE CONSTANTLY LOW.
