stablishment of the foundation represents a successful story of the UAE in very many aspects and its existence reflects the good deeds of the Emirati people, instilled by their great leader and father of the nation. However, the announcement of its establishment on 5th August, 1992, came to translate the wisdom, vision and his willingness to develop mechanisms of charity and raise them to world-class levels using state systems.
