Up to 1 out of 20 children exhibit at least one symptom of a language disorder as they grow.² The symptoms of receptive disorders include:² Difficulty understanding words that are spoken Challenges with following spoken directions Experiencing strain with organizing thoughts Children with receptive challenges will usually display these difficulties before the age of four.² Receptive difficulties may be observed where a child does not properly understand oral communication directed at, or around them. Simple gestures to come, go, or sit still may also prove challenging to comprehend.³ Expressive Language Disorders Expressive language disorders occur when a child is unable to use language to communicate their thoughts or feelings. A child may also consider written communications difficult to express.³ Children with expressive disorders will find it difficult to name objects, tell stories, or make gestures to communicate a point. In this sense, oral communication is just one of the affected areas.
