

Different types of responsibilities exhibited in human transactions are 1. It includes (a) Obligations: A commitment to moral actions (primary obligation to protect the safety of the human beings and respect their rights) (b) Conscientious: A comprehensive perspective to accept the duties, and diligently the right things by putting their heart, head, and hands awareness of the experimental nature of the product/project, anticipating possible and unexpected outcomes, and putting efforts to monitor them), (C) Accountability (being accountable for the decisions, actions, and the results of product/ project including safety), (d) Praiseworthy/Blameworthy as applied to the context of doing things right/doing things wrongly, respectively.
